RESEARCH AND STRATEGY DELIVERY

Bus Investment Fund – East Inverness & HI-Travel

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To update Members on the implementation of the two Bus Investment Fund Projects for which HITRANS are the lead partner - East Inverness Bus Improvement Corridor and HI-Travel. Previous reports have included wider information about the objectives of the projects. This report focuses on the implementation of each project.

East Inverness Bus Improvement Corridor

Total budget for the East Inverness Bus Improvement Corridor project is £2,715,844. This included a contribution of £1.7million from Stagecoach North Scotland towards 12 new Euro 5 low floor vehicles which now operate in the city. Contributions of £107,922 from HITRANS and £200,000 from THC were used to secure £707,922 from the Scottish Governments Bus Investment Fund that extends to March 2015/16.

Progress

To date over £730,000 of new investment has already been committed including the following improvements;

- Installation of over 180 new bus stop flags and display cases with NFC and QR codes to be rolled out at these stops this autumn – These will enable passengers with smartphones to access real-time information for any stop via the Traveline Scotland App.
- New real-time displays at locations such as Academy St, Grant St, Millburn Rd and
- 18 new bus shelters including at Inverness retail park.
- Intelligent bus priority successfully trialled at two junctions on Millburn Rd
- Highland Council have awarded the contract for the redesign of the Tower Road / Barn Church Road junction which will include improved bus priority measures and improve the overall safety of the junction.

2015/16 Implementation

- New bus shelters at Inverness airport and either side of Falcon Square
- New real-time displays at Falcon Square, Inverness Rail Station and new Inverness Campus, UHI
- Roll out of intelligent bus priority at additional 10 junctions.
- Innovative marketing and monitoring of bus services in Inverness and Traveline Scotland
- Also looking to pilot deployment of AVL kits on emergency vehicles in the city to help ensure that they receive a green light at any junction with intelligent traffic light priority.

A current key focus is the ongoing development of the regions first Statutory Quality Partnership between HITRANS, The Highland Council and Stagecoach North Scotland. The SQP will encompass Inverness but with exemptions to ensure that any less frequent bus services will not be affected. Partners are currently looking to agree draft proposals in advance of wider consultation with other stakeholders including local bus operators, Transport Scotland, Confederation of Passenger Transport, Highland Council / HITRANS Members. Among the issues under consideration are a number of infrastructure improvements including a bus lane on Millburn Road.

Progress

Julie Cromarty was appointed as Public Transport Information Officer at the end of January 2015 and has been working with member local authorities to roll out various improvements identified in the application including.

- 250 High Quality Information poles / displays / timetable cases. Priority locations / routes identified to date are Kirkwall, Stornoway, Oban, Fort William and the Service No 35 between Buckie and Portgordon.
- Poster display cases for bus shelters
- A new contract for the supply of 5 solar e-paper displays at key locations in Skye and Lochalsh including Kyle, Kyleakin, Broadford and Uig.
- 4 additional Solar Chronos units at busy stops within the Cairngorm National Park area.
- Supply of real-time displays at locations in Orkney (including Kirkwall Airport), Stornoway, Thurso and Elgin Bus Station.
- Maintenance and support for the JourneyGenie website.
- 5 new bus shelters for key interchanges
- Real-time display and Wifi hotspot in Portree Square
- Roll out of ticket machines with integrated Automatic Vehicle Location equipment.

HITRANS officers are currently in the process of finalising tender documents for procuring a new timetable database as the existing contract with Routewise which covers all HITRANS local authorities comes to an end this autumn. Procurement of a new framework for Real-time information will also take place in the autumn as the current framework contract only extends to the end of 2015.

There is still an element of the budget to be allocated so requests for improvements similar in nature to above will be considered.
