### Active Travel Progress Report

### Purpose of Report

The purpose of this report is to update members on the Active Travel projects and the associated budget available during 2013/14 and 2014/15.

### Active Travel Funding

As discussed at the November meeting, HITRANS have been provided with a budget of £100k per year for 2013/14 and 2014/15 from Sustrans to develop active travel projects within the area.

To ensure that projects provide added value, and will have a direct benefit to the local areas, HITRANS have developed an internal application process (outlined below) to justify the budget provided, and to monitor progress with local projects.

The money is required to be spent on capital works. This can include the development of feasibility studies, design specifications and signage associated with cycling infrastructure. It can also be used for innovative pilot projects. This budget cannot be used as match funding against Sustrans Community Links.

## **Sustrans Cycle Counters**

There are two high profile cycle counters being installed within the HITRANS area, one at Benderloch near Oban on the NCN 78, the second in Millburn Road in Inverness. This is part of a national initiative which will see 10 counters across Scotland in a range of locations to monitor cycle usage as outlined in the November report.

Installation works for the underground components took place during November 2013, but the visible counters may not be in place until April/May 2014 due to an issue with the data cards and problems with power supply to various sites.

## **ERDF Green and Active Travel Project**

HITRANS staff are currently involved in The Highland Council's Green and Active Travel Project. In particular the Active Travel Officer has been working on the creation of an Inverness Active Travel Map to highlight suggested on road cycle routes, off road cycle routes and recreational routes. The map will also provide details of cycle parking, local cycle amenities and key information related to the town.

Once created, this will see the development of similar maps within Wick, Tain, Invergordon/ Alness, Fort William and Dingwall. These maps link directly into the work of the Active Travel Audits.

Part of this project includes the development of an interactive website highlighting the Active Travel Maps. Discussions are ongoing as to the technical detail and tendering processes involved.
