HML Unfazed

Purpose of the report

To provide members with information on the final Highland Mainline Unfazed report.

HML Unfazed- latest

The report has been sent to Transport Scotland, and as a follow up the presentation in Annexe A was made to by the consultants last week.

Our aim to ensure that STPR2 acknowledges the non-delivery of STPR1 as far as the HML is concerned. We should be seeking:

- a low/zero carbon journey experience
- minimum 3hour journey time to Inverness to Glasgow / Edinburgh, with fastest 2h45 (Alex Hynes always likes to say 1 mile per minute to be competitive)
- as a minimum the service pattern agreed through HML phase 2 consultation with secondary stations receiving meaningful calls
- high quality rolling stock
- fully accessible stations that act as tourist hubs with linking bus services and active travel opportunities
- deliver at least a freight path every two and/or an amended method of maintenance allowing overnight freight (1 week in 6 night time closure with diversion via Aberdeen)
- deliver an infrastructure capable of at least 92.5%ppm
- re-signal/re-control the entire route

We will be advancing these arguments in our responses to NPF and STPR2.
