Regional Transport Strategy Update

Purpose of Report

This report provides Members with an update on the development of a new Regional Transport Strategy.

Introduction and Background

HITRANS has a statutory duty under the Transport (Scotland) Act 2005 to produce a Regional Transport Strategy (RTS). Working with local authority partners, HITRANS is in the process of producing a new RTS for the development of transport in the region over the next circa 20 years with the aim of delivering a transport system that *reduces inequalities, takes climate action, helps deliver inclusive economic growth, and improves the health and wellbeing of people in the region.*

The development of the RTS involves three broad stages:

- Stage 1: The Case for Change this initial stage has set out the transport problems in the HITRANS region and established a set of Strategy Objectives focused on addressing these problems.
- Stage 2: Option Generation and Preliminary Options Appraisal this stage involves generating, developing and appraising a set of options which help to resolve the problems identified and deliver the Strategy Objectives.
- **Stage 3: RTS Document** this stage collates the outputs from the above activities into an RTS document ahead of statutory consultation.

Following a public consultation on the initial Case for Change and parallel Impact Assessments, copies of the final versions of each of these documents together with the Case for Change Technical Note can be found on the HITRANS website via this link; www.hitrans.org.uk/Strategy/Regional Transport Strategy

Members and Partnership Advisors were subsequently invited to provide feedback on the Draft Preliminary Appraisal Report and approved the proposed structure for developing the Regional Transport Strategy at the last Partnership meeting in Orkney. Following this meeting, HITRANS officers have been working with Stantec (who have been commissioned to support the development of the HITRANS RTS) to develop an initial working draft of policies and actions that will support the delivery of RTS Strategy Objectives, and by extension address the transport problems identified.

A copy of the draft policies and actions table is attached as Appendix A to this report and Members and Advisors are invited to provide feedback on this initial draft so that a finalised version can be consulted upon as a core element of the final draft Regional Transport Strategy.

Next Steps

Following an initial discussion at the Partnership Meeting, officers will arrange meetings with each partner Council to discuss the draft set of policies and actions (attached in Appendix A to this report) in more detail. The set of actions identified will need to be reviewed and updated on a regular basis and will set out how HITRANS will implement the policies identified in the Strategy, informing its annual Business Plan.

The final Regional Transport Strategy will be accompanied by an Action Plan, that identifies the actions HITRANS will take to progress each policy.
