# Report to Partnership Meeting 26 April 2024

## **RESEARCH AND STRATEGY DELIVERY**

## Research/Strategy Development Programme for 2023/24

#### **SUMMARY**

This Report provides the Partnership Board with an update on progress on delivering the Research and Strategy Development programme and seeks approval of amendments to the programme to reflect commitments made and changing priorities and funding opportunities identified since approval of the 2023/24 Business Plan at the Partnership meeting on 21st April 2023.

#### **DETAIL**

The Partnership at its meeting of 21<sup>st</sup> April agreed the HITRANS Business Plan for 2023/24 which includes a programme for Research and Strategy Development for 2023/24 in support of development, implementation and delivery of the HITRANS Regional Transport Strategy.

Work is progressing on delivery of the Programme as indicated in the Appendix to the report.

The Programme has been amended to reflect changes that have been identified to the circumstances surrounding some projects. The changes are summarised below and more information is provided on each change in Appendix A to this report.

# Summary of key Programme changes:

- Add a new budget line totaling £1,564,000 to support Argyll and Bute Council Ferry Service Capital Improvements. This is budget initially allocated through the Scottish Government Public Transport Fund to Argyll and Bute Council to support improvements in ferry services operated by the Council to secure lifeline connectivity to Luing. The original project did not progress as a review of options to include fixed links was pursued. To avoid the loss of funding it has been by SPT since 2008 on behalf of the Council following an agreement made by HITRANS with SPT. This funding is now being returned to the Council.
- Increase budget allocated to Regional Active Travel Grant by £10,000 to £1,010,000 as Transport Scotland have awarded additional funding to support the development of the Regional People and Places programme.
- Reduce budget for External Funding project development and support to reflect the actual spend allocated to supporting one EU project application and one Smarter Choices Smarter Places funding application.
- Reduce budget for Regionally Significant Scheme Development to reflect actual spend as year end nears.
- Reduce budget for Local Authority Capital Investment Case for support to reflect the actual cost of the work undertaken on this as reported to the November Partnership meeting.

 Increase Intelligent Transport Systems budget by £60,000 following confirmation of increased funding from Transport Scotland through the MaaS Investment Fund grant for the GO-HI app.

With external funding from EU and Scottish Government in place and added to the Research and Strategy Delivery programme budget identified in the core programme there is currently sufficient funding in place to meet a £3,624,000 programme. This is made up of £350,000 of core budget and a draw down against funds secured from SPT (former PTF funding), EU projects, MaaS Investment Fund, Regional Active Travel Grant and Smarter Choices Smarter Places.
