Research/Strategy Development Programme for 2024/25

SUMMARY

This Report provides the Partnership Board with an update on progress on delivering the Research and Strategy Development programme and seeks approval of amendments to the programme to reflect commitments made and changing priorities and funding opportunities identified since approval of the 2024/25 Business Plan at the Partnership meeting on 26th April 2024.

DETAIL

The Partnership at its meeting of 26th April agreed the HITRANS Business Plan for 2024/25 which includes a programme for Research and Strategy Development for 2024/25 in support of development, implementation and delivery of the HITRANS Regional Transport Strategy.

Work is progressing on delivery of the Programme as indicated in the Appendix to the report.

The Programme has been amended to reflect changes that have been identified to the circumstances surrounding some projects. The changes are summarised below and more information is provided on each change in Appendix A to this report.

Summary of key Programme changes:

- Increase Regionally Significant Projects development budget to £40,000 to accommodate the estimated 2024/25 contribution to the Fort William Integrated Transport Plan.
- Reduce budget allocation for local authority ferry service investment to £10,000 with the budget allocated to the OIC UKRI programme project with Artemis for electric ferries.
- Reduce Rail Policy Development budget to £25,000
